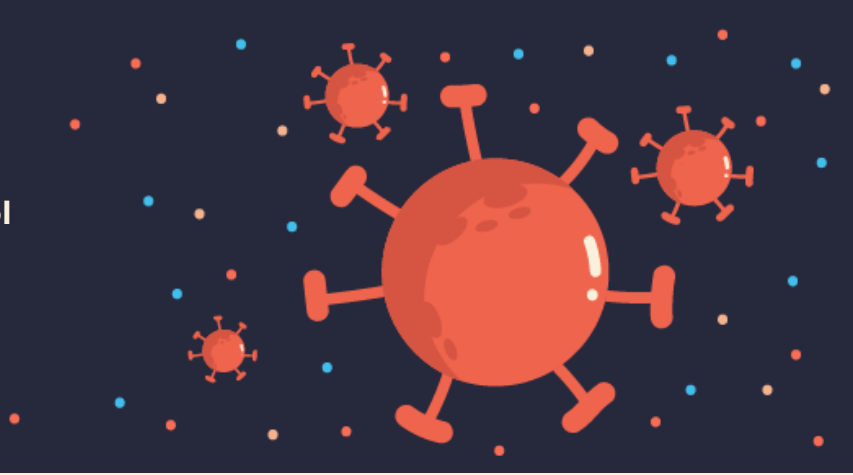


COVID-19

Information and Guidance for High School

The COVID-19 situation is ever changing and we are learning new information from our local, state and federal governments daily. As the situation continues to be fluid and fast-changing, we will try to stay on top of pertinent data and dates. Please note that the answers below address concerns specific to current upperclassmen and their families.



INFORMATION SPECIFIC TO THE CLASS OF 2020:

Q WILL THE CLASS OF 2020 STILL BE ABLE TO GRADUATE?

A Yes. It is our priority to ensure that current seniors have the opportunity to graduate on time. We will be extending remote learning until April 30. Nonetheless, we look forward to returning as soon as possible.

Q WILL EVENTS LIKE PROM, COMMENCEMENT, SENIOR BREAKFAST, AWARD CEREMONIES, ETC. STILL TAKE PLACE?

A We look forward to finishing the school year together, Lord willing. And, we look forward to enjoying as many of the end-of-year opportunities as we possibly can. Our “as-soon-as-possible” return will be informed by guidance from federal, state, and local authorities. We know senior activities are incredibly important and we are working diligently to make sure we are able to provide opportunities for students and families to have these experiences when we are able to do so. 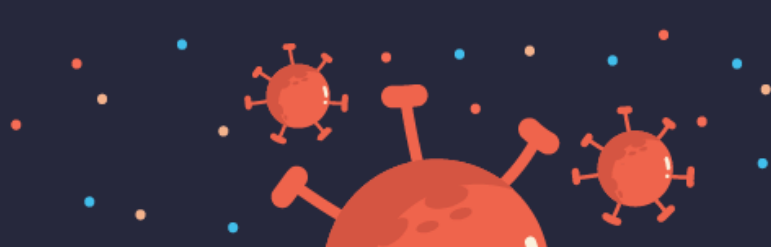

INFORMATION FOR ALL UPPERCLASSMEN:

Q WILL STUDENTS RECEIVE FULL CREDIT FOR SPRING CLASSES?

A Yes, students will be able to receive full credit for spring classes. We will be extending remote learning until April 30. Metro is working to determine how school will look through the end of the year and will release more information soon.

Q WILL MY COUNSELOR BE AVAILABLE FOR QUESTIONS?

Q WILL CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT AT TULSA COMMUNITY COLLEGE CONTINUE?

A Yes. Classes begin on Monday, March 30 at the regularly scheduled time for classes and will be delivered online. Students are expected to attend and complete the assigned work for these classes to complete the course.

Q WILL CLASSES AT TULSA TECH CONTINUE AFTER APRIL 6?

A Beginning April 6th, instruction at Tulsa Tech will be delivered via distance education until the end of the school year. Please check your email for further guidance from Tulsa Tech and read Tulsa Tech's FAQ carefully.

INFORMATION SPECIFIC FOR TESTING:

Q WILL STUDENTS BE ABLE TO TAKE THE SAT AND ACT TESTS?

A College Board has cancelled all SAT testing dates through May. We are waiting for further guidance from College Board. Please check the College Board website for further details. ACT has rescheduled its April 4 national test date to June 13 across the United States. Please check the ACT website for further details.

Q WILL STUDENTS BE ABLE TO TAKE AP EXAMS?

A AP exams will be given online. The exams will be 45 minutes, and they will consist of free response questions only. The exams will cover the material that should have been taught by early March. Students can take the exam using any Internet enabled device including a phone. Additional information on dates will be available by April 3. Please check the College Board website for further details. We recommend all AP students explore the resources on the College Board website including YouTube live videos, released exams, and other things to help you prepare to be successful on your AP exam.
